

## IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT YOUR DRINKING WATER

The City of Waller Public Water System has violated the monitoring and reporting requirements set by the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) in Chapter 30, Section 290, Subchapter F. Even though these were not emergencies, as our customers, you have the right to know what happened and what we are doing to correct these situations.

We are required to monitor your drinking water for specific contaminants on a regular basis. Results of regular monitoring are an indicator of whether or not our drinking water meets health standards. During the June 1 - September 30, 2014 and June 1 - September 30, 2015 periods we did not complete all testing for lead and copper and therefore cannot be sure of the quality of your drinking water during that time.

The table below lists the contaminants that we did not properly test for during the last year, how often we are supposed to sample for copper and lead and how many samples we are supposed to take, of many samples we took, when samples should have been taken, and the date on which the follow-up samples will be taken.
